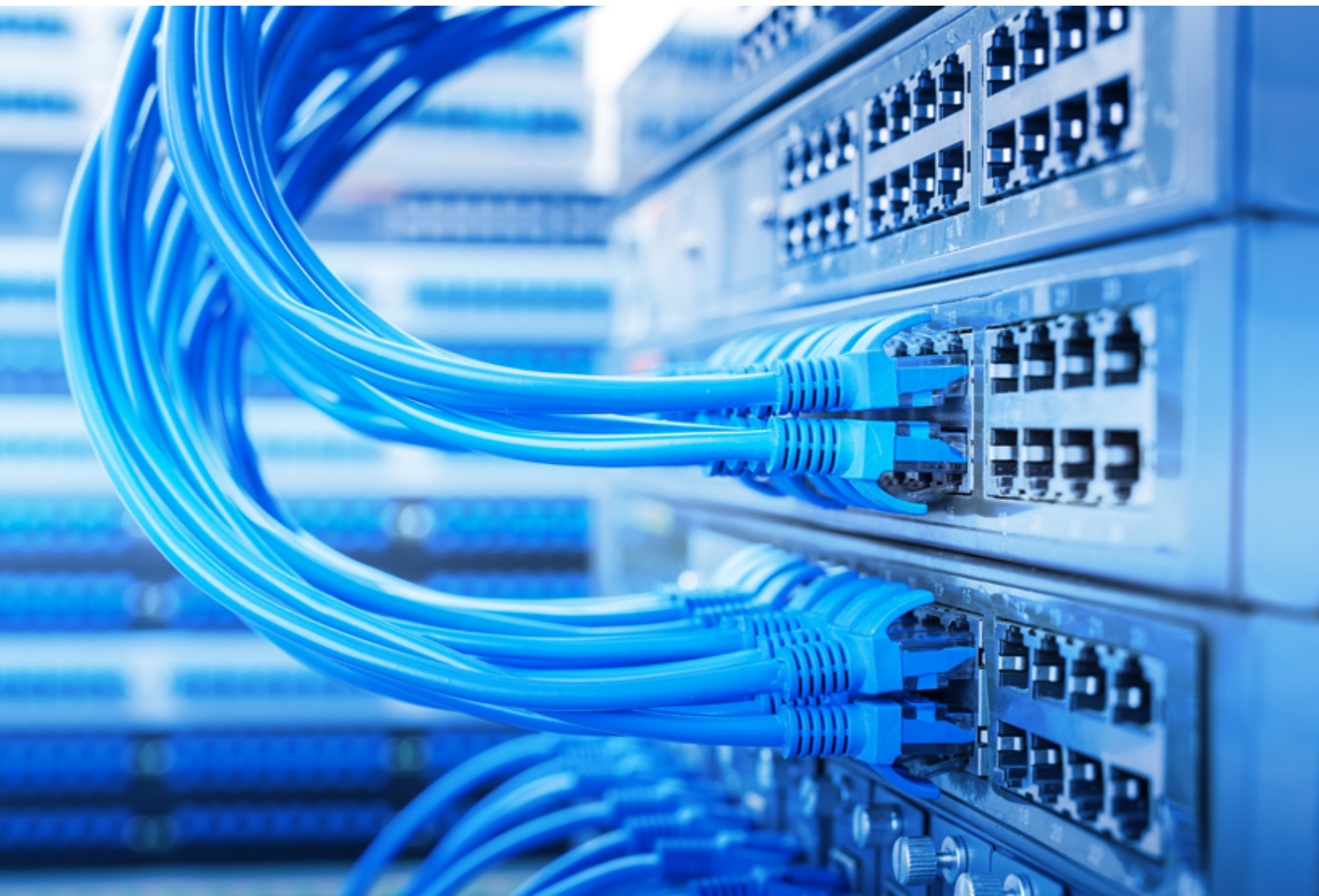
Are Fiber Network Services Right for Your Business?

2. Do the speeds vary based on the number of users?

Bottlenecks can occur if speeds can't accommodate the right amount of users. Your bandwidth should be able to handle maximum employee and visitor demands at your location.

Check that you get the same speed throughout the day, no matter what time of day it is. Some companies may throttle your speeds during peak demands and that would cause headaches for your users.

5. Do you use static IPs?

6. Do you monitor the network for breaches?
