


## Assemble W57R

1. Insert the battery into the handset.






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  - 2. (Optional) Mount the charging cradle to the wall.



3. Connect the charging cradle and charge the handset.



## Hardware Introduction

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No.	ltem	Description	
1	Receiver	Receive audio in receiver mode.	
2	Power LED Indicator	Indicate call status, message status, and charging status.	
3	Phone Screen	Show information.	
4	Soft Keys	Access the function directly. It depends on the operating situation.	
5	Message Key	Access the voice mail or missed call.	
6	Speakerpho ne Key	<ul> <li>Switch among the receiver, headset, and hands-free modes.</li> <li>Answer an incoming call.</li> <li>Place a call in hands-free mode.</li> </ul>	
7	Navigation Keys	Scroll through information or options on the screen.	
8	OK Key	Confirm actions or enters the main menu.	

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9	On-hook Key/Power Key	<ul> <li>Press briefly to return to the previous screen.</li> <li>Long press to return to the idle screen.</li> <li>Press to turn the handset on.</li> <li>Long press on the idle screen to turn the handset off.</li> <li>Cancel actions or ends a call.</li> <li>Reject an incoming call.</li> </ul>	
10	Off-hook Key	<ul> <li>Answer an incoming call.</li> <li>Enter the redial calls list.</li> <li>Place a call in receiver or headset mode.</li> </ul>	
11	Keypad	Provide digits, letters, and special characters.	
12	TRAN Key	Transfer a call to another party.	
13	Mute Key	Toggle mute feature on or off.	
14	Microphone	Pick up audio.	
15	Speaker	Output audio in hands-free mode.	
16	Volume Key +/-	Adjust the volume.	
17	Emergency Alarm Button	Long press 2 seconds to set off the emergency alarm. <b>Note</b> : The settings for this button are configured on the DM/base station where the handset is registered. They cannot be set or changed on the handset. Contact your administrator for more information on which alarm type pressing the alarm button will initiate and whether it is possible to terminate the alarm from the handset.	

## **Power LED Indicator**

LED Status	Description
Solid red	The handset is charging.
Fast flashing red (300 ms)	The handset is ringing.
Slowly flashing red (1 s)	The handset receives a voice mail or has a missed call.
Off	<ul> <li>The handset is powered off.</li> <li>The handset is idle.</li> <li>The handset is fully charged.</li> </ul>

## **Screen and Icons Introduction**

The user screens and icon indicators can help you navigate and understand the important information on the phone's status.

#### Idle Screen and Icons

The idle screen is made up of the signal strength, battery status, status bar, handset name, and soft keys. The time & date is displayed in the middle of the screen.

Status Bar	Displays the feature status icons. The status icons are displayed when features are activated.	
Handset Name	Displays internal handset number and registered handset name (for example, "1" is internal handset number, indicating the handset is the Handset 1 of the base station).	
Soft Keys	The soft key labels on the screen directly above the soft keys show the functions available at that particular moment.



	The ringer volume is 0 and the phone is in the silent mode.
⊄/≥	The phone has enabled the Call Forward feature.
₿/≏	The keypad is locked.
ഫ	The phone has new voice mails.
<b>-</b> / <b>-</b>	The phone has enabled the Do Not Disturb (DND) feature.

#### Line Status Screen and Icons

The line status screen is made up of the outgoing line and line status.

When the handset is idle, you can press **Line** to enter the line status screen. The line status screen is displayed below:

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#### Line screen introduction

Items	Introduction
Outgoing Line	Display the registered line number and the corresponding line (display user name by default). The default outgoing line will be displayed in the first line of the screen.
Line Status	Display the icon of line status. The icon indicates the corresponding feature assigned to the line.

#### **Icon introduction**

Each icon in the line status screen indicates the corresponding feature assigned to the line.

<u> </u>	Anonymous call rejection is enabled
